

THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR. JONATHON

Today's gospel is from Christ's discourse at the Last Supper. He is preparing the disciples for mission, and reassuring them of his constant life-giving presence. In a clear analogy for the relationship between God and his people, Jesus tells them he is the "true vine". All those who respond to Jesus' call to abide with him become branches grafted to the vine. The Father is the owner of the vine. To abide in Jesus means to be in constant communion with him - to draw our strength from him, obey him, to love him and one another, resisting sin and following the promptings of the Holy Spirit. It means to know and give thanks that he is the source of our life and of every good thing we do; and that without him, we can do nothing.

Fruitfulness is not to be confused with success, nor productivity. Jesus is asking for relationships, connectedness, community. When we see our lives conforming to the example of Jesus - when we are loving, compassionate, humble, serving others - we know we are fruitful, as then our lives glorify God.

Yet fruitfulness is no guarantee of a pain free life. Pruning is needed to remove anything that inhibits growth, and it is ultimately for our spiritual benefit. Every branch that bears fruit is pruned in order to produce even more fruit, and no-one is exempt. Anger, pride, envy, selfishness - all this dead wood must go. God prunes his children as sees fit, and he alone decides the quality and quantity of fruit that pleases him. Even good things may have to be lost in order that other things may flourish. During this process remember God is close by, his hand is upon us - it is proof that he loves us personally and that we are his. Through faith, all the challenges and difficulties of our lives can be looked at as opportunities to become more Christ-like. If life is painful for you right now, consider prayerfully - what may be stopping your growth?

ST. LAWRENCE'S PARISH MEETING - DECIDING THE WAY FORWARD

MAY DEVOTIONS - PRAYING THE ROSARY EVERYDAY

The month of May is traditionally dedicated to Our Blessed Lady. To mark our Lady's Month there will be several additions to the regular weekly schedule of services across our parishes. We will crown Our Lady at all Masses on the first weekend of May. Every Saturday Morning at 8.00am there will be Holy Mass, followed by the Holy Rosary at St. Teresa's Church. On Friday 10th May we will be joined by the Children from St. Teresa's for Holy Mass and a May Procession into the school playground. Before every Mass during the week we will also pray the Rosary for peace in the world, in our families and in our daily lives. We will end the month of May with Sung Vespers and a May Procession on Sunday 26th May.

A DAY WITH THE LORD - CORPUS CHRISTI

At the beginning of June we will celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. To mark this Solemnity we will be having a day with the Lord. This will take place on Saturday 1st June at St. Anthony's. We will begin with a votive Mass to Our Lady at 10am followed by Exposition. There will be three talks on the Eucharist spread throughout the day. We will end our Day with the Vigil Mass of Corpus Christi at 5.30pm concluding with a short Eucharistic Procession around the grounds of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM - PREPARATION MEETING

Any Parents hoping to have their child baptised are asked to speak to collect a baptism application form from Fr Jonathon after Sunday Mass. Please note that one parent must be a Baptised Catholic, and at least one godparent should be a practising catholic. Some people are already asking about the next Journey in Faith programme with a view to becoming a Catholic. This will begin at the end of September and run through until after Easter next year. FIRST HOLY COMMUNION MASSES ACROSS OUR PARISHES

Our First Holy Communion Masses will be celebrated throughout the month of May. Please do keep our children in your prayers as they prepare to receive Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time. These are parish celebrations, so please do make every effort to come along and support our young people in their journey of faith.

2024 YEAR OF PRAYER

This is a Year of Prayer, called by Pope Francis to prepare for the Jubilee Year 2025. He asks that during 2024 we focus on the words of the Our Father, and try to get back to what it really means to pray the Our Father. There will be a short series of reflections on the Our Father during Sunday evening Vesper's at St. Teresa's. These will begin on the 12th of May. It is hoped that a number of different people will lead a reflection. More details will follow shortly.

DAILY MASS AND EXPOSITION

Mass is celebrated within our three parishes every day (except a Wednesday). Are you retired? Are you on holiday? Are you free during the day? Do you need some support?
