

THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR. JONATHON

Today's gospel once again places us in the Upper Room, on that Friday morning. Christ's suffering and death are near at hand, and he knows he is leaving his disciples in a hostile world. He intercedes for them, he intercedes for us; and for all Christians to come. He entrusts us all to the loving care and protection of his Father.

What he does not pray for is our withdrawal from the world, or freedom from pain and temptation, much as we may seek this. Joy is not the absence of hardship - it is the deep peace that is found in God, and only in God. This is what makes us different. Jesus wants us in the world, where we live, work, study, and interact. Our commission is to transform mankind, so that all may share and reflect the love found in the Holy Trinity. How can it be that materialism, pride and egotism can be chosen, and God's love rejected? Satan leads this active opposition. As such, Christians are faced with danger; influenced by the world's culture, tempted and deceived constantly, and this is why Jesus asks the Father to protect us "from the evil one". Satan will never defeat God. When we place our faith in Christ, we access a portal to heaven, here on earth. Through the Holy Spirit we are able to acknowledge our sins and mourn our inability to resist temptation. Instead of driving us into despair, our sin drives us to Christ. Joy is found in the words of the tax collector: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner!"

Our lives must conform to the standard of the Trinity - whatever we are doing, we must be people of integrity, filled with truth and love so that others may see us to be what we truly are: disciples of Jesus. We remain in this broken, sin-filled world to gather the lost for Christ - because we are not the only ones he loves and died for. As Pentecost approaches, remember that millions still believe Easter is about rabbits and chocolate eggs. We are here to tell the truth about an empty tomb and risen Saviour.

Before every Mass during the week we will pray the Rosary for peace in the world, in our families and in our daily lives. On Saturday morning at 8.00am there will be Votive Mass of Our Lady at St. Teresa's. We will end the month of May with Sung Vespers and a May Procession on Sunday 26th May at 5.00pm. This will take place at St Lawrence's. Please do spread the word and come along!

A DAY WITH THE LORD - CORPUS CHRISTI

At the beginning of June we will celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. To mark this Solemnity we will be having a day with the Lord. This will take place on Saturday 1st June at St. Anthony's. We will begin with a votive Mass to Our Lady at 10am followed by Exposition. There will be three talks on the Eucharist spread throughout the day. We will end our Day with the Vigil Mass of Corpus Christi at 5.30pm concluding with a short Eucharistic Procession around the grounds of the Church.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION

Every year on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi you are recommissioned to serve in the parish as Eucharistic Ministers. If you would like to continue in this important ministry can you please speak to Fr. Jonathon and fill out a form. You will need to be recommissioned to be able to continue in your ministry. This will take place during the Sunday Masses on the solemnity of Corpus Christi.

2024 YEAR OF PRAYER

This is a Year of Prayer, called by Pope Francis to prepare for the Jubilee Year 2025. He asks that during 2024 we focus on the words of the Our Father, and try to get back to what it really means to pray the Our Father. There will be a short series of reflections on the Our Father during Sunday evening Vesper's at St. Teresa's. These will begin on the 12th of May. It is hoped that a number of different people will lead a reflection. More details will follow shortly.

DAILY MASS AND EXPOSITION

Mass is celebrated within our three parishes every day (except a Wednesday). Are you retired? Are you on holiday? Are you free during the day? Do you need some support? Come to Mass during the week and experience the benefits we receive by doing so. Adoration gives us some quiet time for prayer and peacefulness and at Mass the Lord Jesus feeds us with his body and blood. What a wonderful opportunity lies before us every week!

MASS INTENTIONS

At the Altar the priest offers Mass for the good of the whole Church and for a particular intention. Currently the parishes has very few Mass intentions booked in during the week.
