

THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Today, Jesus returns to his hometown and preaches in the synagogue where he had grown up - only to be rejected by his own people. He was one of their own - they had watched Jesus as a child, knew his family, shared meals and worship - so how had he become so knowledgeable? Why should they respect him? They were taken aback at the power of his presence and his teaching, but couldn't get past Jesus "the carpenter, the Son of Mary" to see his holiness and authority. The Saviour of the world was in their midst, but their closed minds made it impossible for him to help them. He "was amazed at their unbelief".

The people of Nazareth couldn't explain Jesus, so they refused to listen to him. This is still true today. Most people have little trouble with the nativity scene, but won't believe that the baby was God in the flesh, born of a virgin. They are aware of his crucifixion, but won't accept that Jesus rose again from death and still lives today, for our salvation. When people's understanding of Jesus begins and ends with a baby and a crucifixion, they are seriously missing the point. They need to know how and why the Son of God came to earth to live amongst us; how and why God has forgiven all our sins and liberated us from death - and they need their hearts and minds opened to feel how deeply and unconditionally he loves them.

For many Catholics we need to get back to basics, to dust off the Catechism that sits on the shelve, to discuss the big topics of life, to understand the teachings of the Church, but more importantly to grow in our encounter and our love of the Lord. The Nazarenes had "known" Jesus for 30 years, yet had no real relationship with him. How long have you known Jesus? If you would like to know him better, or aren't sure how to explain him to others, what is stopping you from finding out?! It is time that we wake up from our slumber in order to become the missionary disciples that we are called to be.
