THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

"Who do you say that I am?" We believe that Jesus is both God and the Son of God, that he is our Redeemer and Saviour. But how does this translate into our daily lives? "Whoever wishes to be a follower of mine...." is one of the most crucial statements in the whole of the Gospels. It forces us to ask ourselves how much it means to us to be disciples of Jesus. But are we prepared to give what it takes?

Jesus makes it clear that the cross and discipleship are inextricably connected. They always have been; they always will be, but Peter had not yet appreciated this connection. We hear him profess his faith in Jesus, calling him "the Christ". But as soon as Jesus starts explaining what his mission will entail - rejection, suffering and death - Peter objects. Like Peter, we profess Christianity, but often are in denial of the self-giving and acceptance of suffering that this requires.

The Letter of James is still just as powerfully relevant today. In these times of discrimination, poverty and addictions, let us not be Christians who go home from church to live secular lives: "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?" We can only follow Christ if and when we also practice genuine love and care of neighbour and stranger alike. Faith and good works are inextricably tied together, just as discipleship and the cross.

Like Peter, in the light of Jesus' truth we find that we are challenged to re-evaluate our assumptions. A simple prayer practice, an examination of conscience, can help us with this. At the end of the day (or any convenient time), we take 5 to 10 minutes of quiet reflection and silence to look deeper into our life. We examine our relationships, responsibilities and daily encounters, to see if we have met them with love and a true Christian purpose. Where did we fail? Where did we succeed? At the conclusion we thank God for our blessings of the day, ask pardon for our failures, and the grace and strength to follow Christ with a faith that is alive tomorrow

This weekend a national Eucharistic Congress is taking place in Birmingham. Each parish has been invited to deepen our love and devotion to the Eucharist. Therefore, we will be having Sung Vespers, Homily and a Procession TODAY at 5.00pm at St. Lawrence's. Please do come along and walk with Jesus as he continues to bless us and our communities.

There is an expectation that parents are bringing their children to Sunday Mass regularly.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION COURSE 2024/25

Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation will take place this academic year for all in Year 9 and above who wish to receive this Sacrament. This preparation will be done on a partnership-wide basis with sessions taking place at St. Teresa's, Heaton on a Tuesday evening (6.45-8.15pm). BECOMING A CATHOLIC - RCIA
