

THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Many people tend to define and evaluate others (and themselves) in terms of their job, wealth, house, looks, or education. But these things are of no significance whatsoever to God: true value lies in the human being behind the facade. The mistake that the apostles make in today's Gospel is to put social standing first - in their eyes the greatest was the one who had the highest position. Each wanted to get to the top in Jesus' kingdom. But Jesus told them - yet again - that that his kingdom was not about seeking honour and glory for oneself, but about serving others.

Every time Jesus encountered a person deemed worthless by society, he preached this same message. Every time he engaged in conversation with a woman, a leper, a person crippled or deaf or possessed, he spoke loudly and clearly that his first priority was in the value of the person. He cured the illness, forgave the sin, but only after treating the person with compassion and respect first. Jesus was preaching to anyone who would hear that this is the hallmark of ministry and leadership: to serve those who can give nothing in return, to lift up the broken-hearted, the despised, the shunned and to help them to realise that they are loved for who they are, not for what they have or what they can offer.

If you were to list those in our world to whom society effectively accords no status or dignity, it would be a very long list indeed. Many of us in our parishes have been greatly blessed. Much has been given to us in life, and the Gospel demands that we give much to others in return. God entrusts us to use whatever wealth, skills, abilities, and time that we have, as the servants of all. Everyone can and ought to see a true calling from God in their vocation and obligations in life; to do good, to improve the world in which we live, and to correct the abuses and selfishness we encounter.

There is an expectation that parents are bringing their children to Sunday Mass regularly.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION COURSE 2024/25

Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation will take place this academic year for all in Year 9 and above who wish to receive this Sacrament. This preparation will be done on a partnership-wide basis with sessions taking place at St. Teresa's, Heaton on a Tuesday evening (6.45-8.15pm).
